Dr. KATIE SHEEHAN: Role of early mobilisation in outcomes of hip fracture surgery

Dr. Katie Sheehan is a Senior Lecturer in Rehabilitation and Health Services Research at King's College London, UK. She is a physiotherapist and health services researcher with experience from Ireland, Canada, and the UK. Dr. Sheehan is Chair of the Hip Fracture Recovery Research Special Interest Group of the FFN and UK Falls and Fragility Fracture Audit Programme Scientific and Publications Committee



Dr. KATHLEEN MANGIONE: Can older adults post hip fracture achieve recommended guidelines for physical activity?

Dr. Mangione is a professor of Physical Therapy at Arcadia University, Glenside, PA. Her research is focused on exercise with older adults. She recently completed a multicenter trial examining exercise after hip fracture and is currently examining interventions for frail older adults after hospital discharge. Dr. Mangione is a Fellow of the Gerontological Society of America, a member of the FFN and was involved in the recent APTA Clinical Practice Guideline for patients with hip fracture



Dr. PATROCINIO ARIZA-VEGA: Activehip+: Health education and telerehabilitación for patients with hip fracture and their family caregivers

Dr. Ariza-Vega, PT, OT, PhD is an assistant professor at the Physical Therapy Department, University of Granada, Spain. She conducted her research in Denmark (Hvidovre University Hospital, Copenhagen, Canada (Centre for Hip Health and Mobility, Vancouver) and Sweden (Sahlgrenska University Hospital, Gotemburg). She is an activity leader of the European project, ActiveHip+: Activating Older Adults with a Hip Fracture, funded by European Institute of Technology Health


Dr. MAUREEN ASHE
